Torah commentary by Rabbi Abrami

When Zolophehad of the tribe of Manasseh died, he left five daughters and no son. There was no provision in the existing laws of inheritance at the time for women to be able to take possession of their family estate. The daughters protested and, lo and behold, Moses enacted a new law which made it possible for the daughters of Zolophehad to inherit the estate of their father. All they had to do was marry men from the same tribe so that their tribal land would remain within the borders of the Manasseh territory. So it happened that the law of inheritance was modified to include women right at the beginning of our history as a people. It would later be further modified to recognize the full rights of women in the legal context of property laws. (Numbers, chapter 27.)
