SHEMOT

The Mission (3:9-7:13). In the desert God reveals himself to Moses and sends him on his mission. Moses hesitates but, in the end, having been assured that God will aid him, returns to Egypt. There (with his brother Aaron) he inspires his own people with the vision of liberation and confronts Pharaoh with the demand to let Israel go. Pharaoh refuses; the Israelites waver between hope and despair.

Confrontation (7:14-13:16). Through a series of punishments or plagues, the king's resolve is weakened and when his own first-born is taken, he concedes defeat. The God of Israel subdues the god of Egypt. The drama reaches its climax during a fateful "night of watching," and forever after Israel is to retell the tale of redemption through the celebration of Passover. A nation is born.

The Road to Sinai (13:17-18:27). Instead of guiding the Children of Israel by the straight route to Canaan, God leads them by the Reed Sea (Sea of Reeds) where in miraculous fashion they are rescued from who belong to the Nineteenth Dynasty and reigned from 1304-1237. Either he or his son Merneptah was the pharaoh of the Exodus.
