Commentary on Devarim (Deuteronomy) by Rabbi Abrami The fifth book of the Torah contains the last discourse which Moses, our Teacher, delivered to the Children of Israel. In it, he summarizes some of the essential teachings of our faith. Rabbi Jeffrey Tigay states in his introduction to the book (Etz Hayim, Torah and Commentary, United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism): "This discourse is the most vigorous and clear ad-■ vocate of monotheism and the ardent loyalty that Israel owes to ■ God's love, justice and transcendence. It stresses the covenant between God and Israel which was established with the patriarchs ■ and reaffirmed at Sinai"... "The Torah's humanitarianism is most developed in it as is its concern for the welfare of the poor and disadvantaged ... " He concludes with these words: "No address has shaped Jewish consciousness and identity more than Deuteronomy's proclama-■ tion: "Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is One. You shall love Him ■ <sup>I</sup> with all your heart, all your soul, all your might".

*Tisha b'Av* commemorates tragedies that have befallen the Jewish people on this date over the ages, some of which are:

- 587 BCE: destruction of the first temple by the Babylonians
- 70 CE: destruction of the second temple by the Romans
- 135 CE: crushing of the Bar Kochba revolt by the Romans.
- 1290: expulsion of the Jews from England
- expulsion of the Jews from France 1306:
- expulsion of the Jews from Spain 1492:
- ...and, within living memory,
- approval of the "Final Solution" by the Nazi Party 1941:
- 1942: start of mass deportations from the Warsaw ghetto.
