Torah commentary by Rabbi Abrami

Our Torah reading is concerned mainly with the request made by the
 leaders of the tribes of Gad, Reuben and Manasseh. They wanted to
 settle in Gilead, the area east of the River Jordan, which today is known
 as the country of Jordan.

Even though it was located outside the territory of the Promised Land,

Moses agreed to grant them their request on one condition: they were to
assist the other tribes in settling in the land of Canaan, which today is
known as Israel.

■ The members of the twelve tribes of Israel were to demonstrate their soli ■ darity with each other and thus prove that they were one united people.
 ■ That was the reason for this pact of mutual assistance and defense which
 ■ was contracted between the tribes of Gad, Reuben and half of the tribe of
 ■ Manasseh and the other nine tribes of Israel.

Rabbi Abrami will lead services and teach as we observe Tisha b'Av on Saturday 13 August at 7:00 pm and on Sunday 14 August at 8:00 am

This day commemorates tragedies that have befallen the Jewish people on this date over the ages, some of which are:

587 BCE: destruction of the first temple in, by the Babylonians

70 CE: destruction of the second temple in 70 CE, by the Romans crushing of the Bar Kochba revolt in 135 CE, by the Romans.

1290: expulsion of the Jews from England 1306: expulsion of the Jews from France 1492: expulsion of the Jews from Spain

...and, within living memory,

1941: approval of the "Final Solution" by the Nazi Party1942: start of mass deportations from the Warsaw ghetto.
