Shabbat H'ol Ha-Mo-Ed Sukkot

Tradition has it that we read the book of Ecclesiastes or Kohelet on the Sabbath which falls during the Festival of Sukkot, that is this Saturday. The central message of the book can be summed up in the second verse of it: "Vanities of vanities, all is vanity". Several new translations of the bible, have rendered the verse more accurately. One says, "Utter futility, all is futile" "or" "vapor of vapors, all is vapor".

Indeed, the idea that the author is trying to convey is that nothing will exist forever. Everything evolves and will eventually vanish like vapor. But it does not mean that it is vain.
