We now enter upon the final section of the Book of Exodus, dealing with the actual construction of the Sanctuary. Instead of giving a brief notice announcing the execution of the Divine command, Scripture describes in detail now every instruction was faithfully and lovingly carried out.

The Rabbis, assuming that Moses would lose no time in starting upon the work, declare that the assembly occurred on the 11th of Tishri, immediately after his descent from Sinai on the day which was to become the Day of Atonement. The Sanctuary was the concern of every individual in Israel.

The exhortation which God had given to Moses concerning the holiness of the Sabbath, which must not be violated even for the sacred purpose of building the Tabernacle is repeated by Moses to the Congregation.
