

BEHAR - BECHUKOTAI

On <u>the mountain</u> of Sinai, G-d communicates to Moses the laws of the <u>Sabbatical year</u>: every seventh year, all <u>work</u> on the land should cease, and its produce becomes free for the taking for all, <u>man and beast</u>.

Seven Sabbatical cycles are followed by a <u>fiftieth year</u>—the Jubilee year, on which work on the land ceases, all indentured servants are set free, and all <u>ancestral estates</u> in the Holy Land that have been sold revert to their original owners. Additional laws governing the sale of lands, and the prohibitions against <u>fraud</u> and <u>usury</u>, are also given.

G-d promises that if the people of Israel will keep His commandments, they will enjoy <u>material prosperity</u> and dwell secure in their homeland. But He also delivers a harsh "<u>rebuke</u>," warning of the <u>exile</u>, persecution and other evils that will befall them if they abandon their covenant with Him. Nevertheless, "Even when they are in the land of their enemies, <u>I will not cast them</u> <u>away</u>; nor will I ever abhor them, to destroy them and to break My covenant with them; for I am the L-rd <u>their G-d</u>."

The Parshah concludes with the rules on how to calculate the <u>values</u> of different types of pledges made to G-d.
