True freedom requires shared laws, values, and an educated people

Physical freedom alone, which the Israelites obtained with the release from bondage at Pesach, is not enough to render long-lasting results. Think about the various countries in the last decade that have overthrown oppressive regimes without yielding long-term freedom to their citizens. There needs to a second more enduring move in order to ensure that freedoms gained won't be lost all over again. The second stage is creating a shared vision of how the newly freed society will function via an agreed upon system of laws and values.

The Revolutionary War did not produce the United States of America. The first "constitution," The Articles of Confederacy, it could be argued, also did not give us a national identity, but rather a working arrangement between the original 13 sovereign states. Only with the ratification of the US Constitution in 1789, thirteen years after the Declaration of Independence, spelled out the values and requirements necessary to forge these states into a single country.

Seven weeks after Pesach, we commemorate the Jewish move from independence to true nationhood. Only by accepting on ourselves the binding laws of the Torah, and the common values which we call the "Holiness Code," do we begin to forge the identity of a (somewhat) unified people. Every year we celebrate this pivotal moment in our collective history as the holiday of Shavuot.

One more element both our Jewish ancestors and founding fathers knew was crucial for the long-term success of both these enterprises was the need for an educated population, and a culture that is focused on the value of lifelong learning. Without an ability to always learn, and grow and change based on what we learn, no society can thrive in the long run. In Judaism, we see this by the development of new texts and writings in each generation for over 2 millenia. In the United States, we realized this by the radical idea at the time that all children are entitled to education as a right.

The need for quality Jewish learning is a desire that extends all through our lives, and is especially needed here in the West Valley. I have found in my first year that people are really hungering for learning opportunities. Therefore, a big part of our programming for the coming year will be to increase our educational offerings, and to be open to everyone who wishes to learn.

To that end, we are excited to announce the beginnings of what will become a fabulous year of Jewish learning for all.

Beth Emeth Congregation in conjunction with the Jewish Worship Group of Sun City Grand will partner with Valley Beit Midrash to bring an exciting line-up of internationally renowned speakers to the West Valley in the coming year. Thanks to a very generous seed grant from Joani Frankel, a local realtor, we have raised the funds to have 4 very exciting speakers come to Beth Emeth from November - March. The lectures will be held either on Monday or Tuesday afternoons from 1-2 pm. More details will be published over the summer.

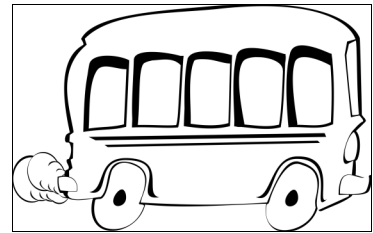

DID YOU KNOW ??????????????

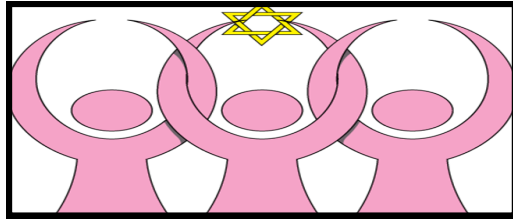
The association between Jews and joking has become so powerful that Jewish humor is now all too easy to detect even where it doesn't really exist. This phenomenon should perhaps be named the Mrs. Morgenbesser Effect. Once, when asked how she was faring, the mother of Sidney Morgenbesser, a New York philosopher, is reported to have replied, "Not so good — thank God." At first, this sounds like glumness mocking itself. But once you know that religious Jews of a certain vintage are apt to thank God more or less as a matter of punctuation, it is not so clear any sort of humor was intended. The potential for accidental comedy in Jewish speech is of course enhanced by the fact that Jews have often had to stumble in someone else's language.

- 1** There are 5.3 million US Jews - 2.2 per cent of the population.
- 2** The oldest congregation is New York's Sephardi Shearith Israel community (1654).
- 3** The first American Haggadah was published in 1837 by S.H. Jackson.
- 4** To meet the demand from Jewish immigrants in 1911, a kosher kitchen was built at their arrival point at Ellis Island.
- 5** There are no Jewish Republicans in the Senate or the House. The Democrats have 22 Congress members and 11 Senators.
- 6** Christopher Columbus's interpreter on his voyage to the New World was Yosef Halevy, a Catholic convert.
- 7** The words "...give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses..." on the Statue of Liberty were written by a Jewish woman, Emma Lazarus.
- 8** The first openly Jewish senator was Judah P. Benjamin, a slave owner representing Louisiana.
- 9** Judith Resnick was the first Jewish astronaut in space. She died in the Challenger shuttle disaster in 1986.
- 10** Baseball player Sandy Koufax refused to play in the first game of the 1965 World Series because it fell on Yom Kippur.
- 11** In a 1934 basketball game between New York University and City College of New York, nine out of the 10 starting players were Jewish, Newsweek proclaimed it a sport "at which Jews excel".
- 12** Immigrant Julius Meyer lived with Sioux Indians in Nebraska in 1867 and became known as Curly-Headed White Chief with One Tongue due to his honesty.

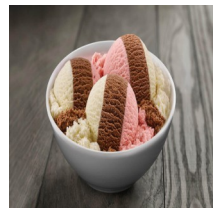

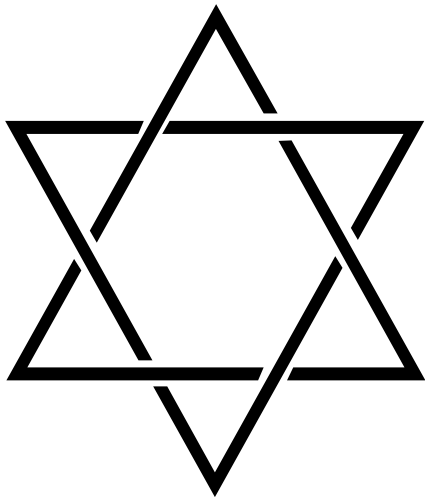
Jewish Family and Children's Service (JFCS)

Ellie Schwartzberg of Jewish Family and Children's Service (JFCS) offers individual counseling, referral to appropriate resources and advocacy to Jewish people living in the Sun Cities and surrounding communities.

This is a free program underwritten by the Jewish Federation. Ellie has a Master's degree in counseling from ASU and has been at JFCS for the past 32 years working with an older population. She is currently the Vice President of Geriatric Services at JFCS. Ellie offers this program at the Sun Cities Community Services Building on Tuesdays (9451 N. 99th Ave. Sun City) and at Beth Emeth Synagogue (13702 W. Meeker, Sun City West) on Thursdays. Counseling addresses such issues as coping with bereavement and loss, care-giving stress, long term planning and decision making, adjustment to chronic health problems, loss of independence, depression, couples' issues, communication and problem solving with adult children, etc.

Ellie facilitates a Bereavement Support Group at Beth Emeth Congregation every Thursday from 1:00-2:00 PM. This group is open to anyone who has lost a spouse or significant other within the past two years.

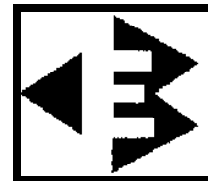
