Welcome to an almost New Year 5779. We are all so excited to show off our exciting and improved Beth Emeth! As we gear up our programming year, we hope that not only will you take advantage of our new offerings, but that you will encourage your friends and neighbors to be part of our exciting additions.

Building

First, in terms of our physical facility, you will notice our new parking lot and you won't see, but will certainly feel the new air compressors in the sanctuary & social hall. Our congregation's investment in both of these essential items is a demonstration of our commitment that we are going to be a center of Jewish life in the West Valley for many years to come.

High Holy Days

Second, we hope you will participate with us in our High Holy Day services again this year. We are delighted that we will be joined by the Beth Emeth choir under the superb direction and accompaniment of Sid Engel, a long-time Hollywood musical director, who will truly elevate the quality of our beautiful Holy Day music.

Community Partnerships

Third, I have long been a proponent of partnering with anyone we can to build-up opportunities for Jewish life in our community. For that reason, we partnering with a number of organizations to bring more Jewish learning and experiences to our end of the Valley.

We are delighted to announce that we are partnering with Phoenix-based Valley Beit Midrash (VBM) and the Jewish Worship Group of Sun City Grand (JWG) to bring 6 prominent exciting national Jewish speakers to Beth Emeth for lectures on their areas of specialty. A big thank you to local realtor Joani Frankel for the seed money that is making this possible. The series begins November 5, and more detailed information will be in the September Observer.

- We are once again partnering with the local Bureau of Jewish Education (BJE) and Temple Beth Shalom of the West Valley (TBS) to bring their Wednesday morning adult education series to the West Valley. Fall classes will be held at TBS beginning October 10 for six weeks, and spring classes will be at BEC beginning January 23. I will be teaching for both.
- Jewish Family and Children's Service (JFCS) will continue offering their weekly bereavement support group on Thursdays at 1 pm in our library, and Ellie Schwartzberg is available earlier in the day for individual counseling.
- We will also be partnering with the JWG for 4 special Friday night services featuring Jewish musical guests. Dinner will be served at the shul before these special community events. Stay tuned for dates & details.

Adult Learning

Fourth, as many of you know, my passion lies in teaching, so with the expanded hours in my new contract, we hope to expand the educational offerings at the shul. More details will be published in our forthcoming Adult Learning brochure, which will be available at the High Holy Day services.

My Thursday morning class for the year will be, "The Hidden Secrets of the 10 Commandments." This will be an in-depth exploration of the deeper meanings within the world's most famous top ten list. Classes will be the first and third Thursday of the month at 10:30 am, beginning October 18th.

• I will also be offering an Introduction to Judaism class on the second and fourth Thursdays of the month, starting October 25th at 10:30 am. This is a class for those, Jewish and non-Jewish, who want to know more about the basic aspects of Jewish life. We need to have a minimum of 8 people registered for the class to run, so please contact the office to express your interest.

• For women and men who may have never had a chance to celebrate a Bar or Bat Mitzvah, we hope to offer an Adult B'nei Mitzvah class which will meet weekly on Tuesday mornings beginning October 9. Ability to read Hebrew is helpful, but not necessary. I will be coteaching this with our Rebbitzin, Keren Goldberg. We need at least 6 people to sign up, so please contact the office to express your interest and for more details.

• I will be offering 2 series of the transformative Wise Aging program running for six sessions. The first series begins on October 9, and the second series will begin on January 8, on the second & fourth Tuesdays. More details will be in the brochure next month.

DID YOU KNOW


Considering we're in the midst of a crazy monumental historical moment (AKA Hillary Clinton is the first female presidential nominee of a major political party in the U.S., and could very well be the first woman president). Whether or not you're voting for Clinton doesn't change the fact that it's a first. And firsts are pretty important for Jews (maybe we'll be able to say a <u>Shehecheyanu</u> tomorrow... pu pu pu).

Because of all these firsts, it got us thinking about all the times Jewish women made history. There are way too many to name in one post, but here are some of our favorites:

- **1.** <u>Rosalie Silberman Abella</u> was Canada's first Jewish woman judge and the country's youngest ever. She was also the first woman chair of the Ontario Labour Relations Board and the first woman in the British Commonwealth to become the head of a Law Reform Commission. As if that's not enough, she was appointed to the Supreme Court of Canada in 2004, becoming the first Jewish woman to sit on the Canadian Supreme Court bench.
- **2.** <u>Ruth Bader Ginsburg</u> is the first Jewish woman to become a Supreme Court justice (and only the second woman ever after <u>Sandra Day O'Connor</u>).
- **3.** <u>Rebecca Zerline</u> was apparently the first woman physician in the world, according to Dr. Oscar Leibowitz, a former director of the Hamburg Sanitarium. Dr. Leibowitz said that Dr. Zerline was considered a famous oculist in her time—and practiced as early as 1430 in Frankfort.
- **4. <u>Helen Goldmark Adler</u>**, along with her husband, helped establish the first model tenements at Cherry Street in New York as well as the first free kindergarten in America, called the Working Man's School. Later she founded the Ethical Culture School at Fieldston in the Bronx.
- **5.** <u>Gloria Steinem</u> became the first woman to speak at the <u>National Press Club</u> in 1972. She also attended the first women-only Passover seder held in <u>Esther M. Broner's</u> New York City apartment in 1976.
- **6. <u>Golda Meir</u>** was Israel's first elected Prime Minister from 1969 until 1974.
- **7.** <u>Regina Jonas</u> was ordained privately and became the world's first ordained female rabbi in Germany in 1935.
- **8.** <u>Birdie Amsterdam</u> was the first woman elected to the New York State Supreme Court on January 6, 1957.
- **9.** <u>Hedy Lamarr</u> invented technology that led to what we now know as wifi. In 2014, Lamarr was posthumously inducted into the <u>National Inventors Hall of Fame</u>.
- **10.** <u>Barbra Streisand</u> is recognized as holding the record for the most Top 10 albums of any female recording artist (not to mention *Jewish* female recording artist): a total of 34 since 1963.
- **11.** <u>Judith Resnik</u> was the first Jewish woman (and second woman in general) to travel to space. Sadly, Judith Resnik lost her life in the tragic explosion of the space shuttle Challenger in 1986.



A break-fast in <u>Judaism</u> is the meal eaten after <u>fast days</u> meals such as <u>Yom Kippur</u> and <u>Tisha B'Av</u>. ^[1] During a Jewish fast, no food or drink is consumed, including bread and water. The major fasts last over 25 hours, from before sundown on the previous night until after sundown on the day of the fast. ^[2] Four other shorter fasts during the year begin at dawn and end after sunset. ^[3] In Islam <u>fasting</u> mostly occurs during the month of "Ramadan" where Muslims fast for the whole duration of the month for around 30 continuous days. The fasting starts at dawn and ends by sunset where the first meal "break fast" is eaten. During the time of fast no form of food and drinks are consumed.

Occurrence

A break-fast follows each of the major Jewish fast days of Yom Kippur and Tisha B'Av, as well as the four minor fast days of <u>Fast of Gedalia</u>, <u>Fast of Esther</u>, <u>Tenth of Tevet</u>, and Seventeenth of Tammuz.

Description

To break the fast, it is customary to eat a light meal consisting of <u>salads</u> and <u>dairy</u> foods. Heavy food on an empty stomach is usually avoided. Sometimes the fast is broken with <u>tea</u> and <u>cake</u> before eating a full meal. A drink of <u>milk</u> or <u>juice</u> before the post-fast meal helps the body to readjust and diminishes the urge to eat too much or too rapidly.


Customs for the first food eaten after the Yom Kippur fast differ. Iranian Jews often eat a mixture of shredded apples mixed with rose water called "faloodeh seeb." <u>Polish</u> and <u>Russian Jews</u> will have tea and cake. <u>Syrian</u> and <u>Iraqi Jews</u> eat round sesame crackers that look like mini-<u>bagels</u>. <u>Turkish</u> and <u>Greek Jews</u> sip a sweet drink made from <u>melon</u> seeds. Some people start with <u>herring</u> to replace the salt lost during fasting. [7] North African Jews prepare butter cookies known as <u>rhuraieba</u> ("ribo" among Moroccan Jews) for the meal after the Yom Kippur fast. [8]

Orthodox Jews generally do not eat meat or drink wine at the break-fast after Tisha B'Av because the burning of the Temple on the 9th of Av is said to have continued until noon on the 10th of Av. [9] Even when the 9th of Av falls and Shabbat and Tisha B'Av is observed on the 10th, though all other Nine Days restrictions end with the fast, wine and meat are customarily still not consumed at the break fast.






