



FROM THE DESK OF TRACEE ROSEN, RABBI

ONE PAGE AT A TIME

I've told the story more than once of being a young girl in day school in Denver. When we reached seventh grade, they split the classes for the Jewish studies portion of the school day into boys classes and ones for girls. In the after-school period which was mandatory for middle-school, boys began learning Mishnah then Gemara (the two main documents that make up the Jewish Talmud). We girls were assigned to Home Ec. I never really learned to sew worth a darn, but I was intensely curious about what was so special that the boys could learn it, but that it wasn't appropriate for us.

In the 1960's, Rabbi Joseph Soloveitchik, z"I, one of the greatest thinkers and institution builders in American Orthodox Judaism began to allow young women to learn Talmud, defying centuries of rabbinic edicts saying that any father who taught his daughter Talmud was teaching her to become promiscuous. His view on this issue, unfortunately, was not widely shared in the orthodox world at the time. In Denver of the 1970's, young women did NOT learn Talmud.

Over the past 40 years much has changed. The creation of Jewish Studies programs at mainstream universities, women being admitted to the various denominations rabbinical schools, publication of 2 high quality English translations/explanations of the entire Talmud, all contribute to the increased exposure that has made learning Talmud more popular than at any time in Jewish history. And women have become an important part of this learning process.

On January 1, 2020 over 95,000 Jewish men gathered in Metlife Stadium in NJ along with hundreds of thousands in cities all over the world to celebrate the completion of the 13th cycle of studying the entire Talmud (Siyum HaShas), one folio page per day for $7 \frac{1}{2}$ years. It's a program called Daf Yomi (daily page [of Talmud]) which has been run worldwide since 1931.

What generated major attention and excitement this year was the simultaneous gathering in Jerusalem of over 3,300 **women**, who celebrated the achievement of women who had completed this long and difficult feat. Organized by Rabbanit Michelle Farber, a modern Orthodox American-born woman who lives in Ra'anana, Israel, she herself began learning Talmud at a young age & earned a PhD in Talmud from Bar Ilan University. She set out about 8 years ago to create an opportunity for women to study all over the world, culminating in the Women's Siyum HaShas celebration in January.

With the resulting publicity from this historic event, thousands of women (and men) all over the world have now taken on daily Talmud study from all streams of life. In the past month, I have been surprised and amazed at the number and variety of people who are challenging themselves to learn. I am proud to be one of them. I had often thought about committing to learn a page a day, and never thought I had the time. These days I am blessed with a 45 minute commute, which is the perfect amount of time to listen to a daily lesson in the car.

You might be wondering, "Why would I ever want to study Talmud? I study Torah, I read Jewish books, what more do I need?" In truth, the Talmud is more of a foundational document for Judaism than even the Bible itself. While certainly based on the Jewish Bible, it is the Talmud that addresses the development of Jewish life and practices that have evolved since the destruction of the Second Temple in 70 C.E. To gain an understanding of Talmudic content and reasoning, is to open the doors to the ever evolving understanding of what it means to be Jewish, the way we and our ancestors lived our Judaism. Even if we don't observe every detail of every ritual, we become aware of how these rituals originated, the intent behind them and why they may or may not apply to our own lives in modern times. Learning Talmud gives us a seat at the table over which a conversation that has been going on for 2000 years is happening. It also gives us a language to speak with and understand the practices and beliefs of other Jews with whom we disagree. If we are ever going to find ways to bridge so much of what divides the Jewish people these days, starting with a common language and common points of reference will be vital. Moreover, there are now such a wide variety of books, daily email services, podcasts & videos available, appealing to learners of all levels, and mostly accessible to those who don't know Hebrew or Aramaic. I've compiled a list of resources, mainly for more beginning learners that could help you become part of the real Jewish conversation. I hope you will take time to begin the process of learning more about your heritage and the amazing wisdom and logic of our ancestors. It's never to late, and you just need to take it one page at a time.

WEBSITES

Sefaria.org - the world's largest Jewish on-line library of sacred texts offers the entire Talmud, commentators, and more at the click of your mouse (or phone). Google Sefaria Daf Yomi, and it will take you to the modern translation by Rabbi Steinsaltz in English.

<u>Hadran.co.il</u> - The website created by Rabbanit Michelle Farber contains links to her daily podcast (for intermediate level learners) as well as other related content created by women.

Steinsaltz-center.org - click on "Today's Daf" at the top of the page. Presents a brief summary of the text, themes & lessons we can learn from the content of each day's teaching.

EMAIL SERVICES

MyJewishLearning.com - A daily dose of Talmud - a summary or highlights of a key story or concept from the day's page written by a rotating group of rabbis from different denominations.

PODCAST





If you have ever wished that you had a chance to celebrate a bat or bar mitzvah in the synagogue, now is your chance. Under the gentle guidance of Rebbetzin Keren Goldberg and Rabbi Rosen, you'll learn about the Shabbat morning prayer service, how to lead selected prayers, how to have an aliyah to the Torah and master a portion of Torah or Haftarah reading. The culmination will be a group celebration at services on June 6, 2020. There are no prerequisites, but the ability to read Hebrew at any level and familiarity with the Shabbat morning service are both pluses. If you can't read Hebrew, we will work with you to meet your goals. Minimum registration is 4 students.

Beth Emeth Congregation offers Basic Judaism course

Beth Emeth Congregation in Sun City West (13702 W. Meeker Blvd) is beginning a series of classes on Basic Judaism starting February 12. This class, taught by Rabbi Tracee Rosen, is for learners who want to know more about the Jewish religion, beliefs, rituals, and history. It is open to everyone. No prior background is required.

The class will be conducted in 5 subject blocks, each covering a major topic in 3-5 weekly sessions.

- **Block 1(February 12 March 11)**: An introduction to **Jewish ritual life**, including learning about the synagogue, Jewish prayer, the observance of the Sabbath, and the dietary laws.
- Block 2 (March 18 April 1, April 22 29): Basic Jewish history from Biblical Civilization through the Emancipation/Enlightenment of the 19th century.
- Block 3 (May 6 June 3): Jewish holiday celebrations: High Holy Days, Pilgrimage festivals of Passover, Shavuot, and Succot, other less known commemorations.
- Block 4 (June 3 24): Jewish life cycle observances: birth, coming-of-age, marriage, death, afterlife.
- Block 5 (August 5 -26): Judaism in modernity: Antisemitism, Holocaust, State of Israel, American Jewish varieties, Jewish ethical teachings.

All classes will be held on Wednesday mornings from 10am - 11:30am in the Beth Emeth library. Participants are welcome to attend any blocks of classes they desire, or chooses individual topics. A suggested donation of \$10 per session is requested for non-members of the synagogue.



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

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

- Ellie facilitates a Bereavement Support Group at Beth Emeth Congregation every Thursday from 1:00-2:00 PM. This group is open to anyone who has lost a spouse or significant other within the past two years.
