FROM THE DESK OF RABBI TRACEE ROSEN

Dear Beth Emeth family & friends,

I sincerely hope this message finds you healthy & safe. Events of the past 2 weeks here in Arizona are certainly teaching us that we are not out of the woods yet. I'd like to give you an update on what's going on with the shul. We will not be able to return to a complete in-person schedule for the foreseeable future. This is both unfortunate and also potentially a blessing. We prefer to be together in person - it creates more meaningful relationships. But creating an online presence means that we can include more of our community who have been unable to participate in in-person activities due to mobility or health issues.

We have created a committee comprised of Tom Behrent, Arnie Becker, Tricia Thomas (our office manager), and myself to create a set of policies and procedures for deciding when, how & to what extent to resume in-person activities at the synagogue building. I know you all miss being together for special times, and I miss seeing you all in person. Please know that we are doing everything possible to adhere to the highest guidelines for preserving everyone's safety.

While we don't have definitive answers about when the building will open (and it will open!), I can give you some general ideas about what we are planning.

General thoughts

- All of the activities that make being part of a synagogue community so enjoyable: shmoozing, kiddush & onegs, making human contact, shaking hands & offering a yasher koach to a friend, are the exact activities we have to avoid. This will be doubly hard after months of no contact.
- Regardless of when we feel we can open, a number of you may need to remain away from public spaces for your own health requirements. Any on-site activities we do we will need to be able to broadcast on-line as well. (more on this below).
- One guideline we will follow is to allow time to elapse between group gatherings. In all likelihood, we will continue to do video services in the evenings and in-person services in the mornings. Second day services will also need to be on-line, so that we can provide optimum time for any virus particles to be destroyed.
- This means that one goal we have is to get as many of our community connected to on-line access as possible in the next 2 months. This virus and its effects are with us for the long term. Senior citizens need to be especially careful in not rushing social contact as the risks are so much higher for us.
- Once we feel confident that we can safely open the building, it will only be with adequate disinfecting and social distancing procedures in place. In terms of seating capacity, that means about 40 seats in the sanctuary, and about 80-85 seats including Hindin Hall would be able to safely be set up.
- The primary drivers in spreading the coronavirus are proximity and time. Remaining 6 or more feet apart with a mask will significantly reduce aerosol droplets. But the amount of time spent in such a setting is also crucial. Indoor gatherings of more than one hour increase our risk. The days of 3-5 hour services even on the High Holy Days must become a thing of the past; we will need to shorten the length of our prayer services (I just heard your sigh of relief all the way in Phoenix - please try harder to hide your disappointment (wink emoji)). This means that some parts of the services may be omitted or available to view at home on your own.
- Prayerbooks, Machzorim for the High Holy Days, and Chumashim (Torah books) will need to be reserved & labeled for individuals. Guidelines we have received are that printed material cannot be sanitized, and should be left untouched for 7 days before being used by someone other than the last user. You are welcome to come by the synagogue any weekday between 9-12 and borrow a siddur and/or Chumash. They are yours to use at home until it is safe to return them. We will similarly make Machzorim available for your home use.
- Communal kippot and tallitot (yarmulkes & tallises) will not be available. You must bring your own.
- We hope to set-up the option to view our in-person services on-line using Facebook Live, and/or optimally, our own website. If you don't have internet access, wifi, or a computer with a camera & microphone, please seriously consider adding these to your life. See the Zoom & Online Access article elsewhere (page 4) for other options to participate.

As we learn more and evaluate the situation here in Arizona, we will keep you up to date with more detailed plans. Please know that ensuring the safety of all of us is our TOP priority. As the Talmud teaches, "The saving of a life overrides nearly all other mitzvot."

Please know, I am always available for one-on-one chats - by phone, Facetime, Zoom, whatever. Please contact me directly at 602-688-4312.

Zoom & On-line Access - Connect with your community

Since March, we have been using Zoom to offer services, classes and face-to-face opportunities to just chat. If you haven't joined us already, please take an opportunity to do so. Friday and Saturday access codes are below.

If you aren't yet able to use Zoom, here are some options to get you started:

NO INTERNET?

If you don't have access to the internet, you can still listen to services by dialing in on a regular phone.

- Call +1 669 900 9128 from a land line or mobile phone
- When prompted, key in the 10-digit meeting ID and then the Passcode, and you will connect to our service. We won't be able to see each other, but you will be able to participate via audio.

COMPUTER, BUT NO CAMERA OR MICROPHONE?

- You can still download Zoom onto your computer and see us (go to <https://zoom.us/download> to download the software you might need. If you don't have speakers, or you want to communicate with the group, you can dial in from your regular phone using the procedure above. We won't be able to see you, but you will see us.
- Starting in September, we plan to begin streaming our services via Facebook Live. When we do that, you will be able to watch on-line anonymously.

WANT HELP GETTING STARTED?

- In August, we plan to offer small socially distanced tutoring to help you set up your own portable device for easy access. If you don't have a tablet and want to purchase one, we can help with that, too. Please contact Tricia in the office at 623-584-7210 for more information.
- If you need to get internet access or wi-fi service, please contact your local neighborhood association. Most can help you find the service provider(s) for your community and the options available.

At Hacienda de Sarah, we are committed to providing quality services to our members. This year has brought such a unique time for everybody, and considering the circumstances happening around us, it has brought a tidal wave of emotions. But you know what, God is in the midst of the chaos. He is always there, and he is *still* here with us. Hacienda de Sarah would like to thank Beth Emeth Congregation for not only opening the doors of their beautiful Synagogue, but for opening their hearts as well.

A note about the back parking lot from Jordan Colbert, 1st Vice-President . . .

I'm sure that most of you have noticed the activity on the back portion of the synagogue property. It has been leased out to a power line company. They have a contract with APS to repair and upgrade a lot of the power structures in Sun City West. The rent is \$800 per month and will go through October or November. At that time all of the fencing will be taken down at no cost to the synagogue.

Also, concerning the back portion of the property, we are deep into the rezoning process in order to be able to have a developer build apartments back there. There has been some opposition from the single-family homes on the other side of the wall. We have been meeting with the representatives of their homeowners association and have come to an agreement to do the following. The height of buildings will be limited to 30 feet and no buildings will be built within 40 feet of their property. We are currently scheduled for the July 22 board of supervisors meeting at which time we hope to get final approval. The meeting will be online. The property can then be sold and the funds be used for the benefit of the synagogue.

We hope to do some very much needed maintenance and upgrades to the building and also establish an endowment fund to ensure the future of the congregation. It has been a long trek but we are nearing the finish line.

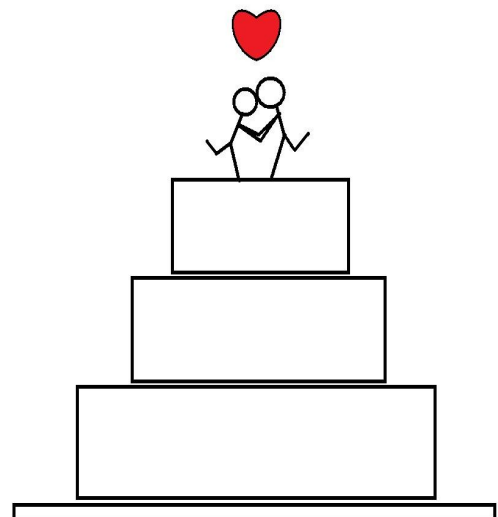

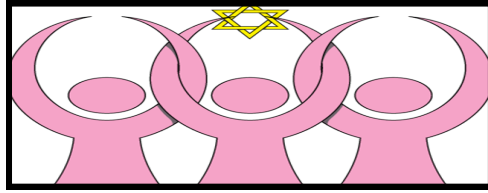
