

FROM THE DESK OF TOM BEHRENDT, PRESIDENT



First, and of great importance to all of us: We have accepted the resignation of Rabbi Lipschultz, effective immediately. A search has begun for a replacement and we are working with the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism toward that end. In the meantime, Rabbi Robert Sternberg has graciously agreed to lead our services until a replacement is found.

As you may know, Rabbi Sternberg is, and has always been, a wonderful friend of Beth Emeth. His work on the Holocaust was the basis for our joint Yom Hashoah service with Beth Shalom--a powerful reminder of "Never Again". I believe he was not thanked sufficiently at the joint service and I am glad to take this opportunity to thank him again, publicly, for both his past help and his upcoming assistance as we go through a difficult transition.

Please note that our Erev Shavuot service will be held motzei Shabbat, Saturday evening, June 4th and we will, of course, have services on Sunday and Monday, June 5th and 6th when the Book of Ruth will be read and homemade cheesecake will be served. Yizkor will be recited on Monday June 6th.

Looking forward to the High Holydays, I am pleased to let you know that Cantor Judith Levy will again lead us beautifully through the Yom Tovim.

The Board has also decided that starting in September, the Misheberach list will be posted for a month at a time. Please call the office to add someone to the list.

We will also have a Birthday/Anniversary Kiddush on one Shabbat each month and hope that those celebrating will join us on those days.

As some of you may already know, we are applying for a Bingo license and hope to run games on Sundays in partnership with the Unity Light of Grace Church. We will be looking for volunteers to help run the program and hope that you will step up to help. As you know, annual dues do not cover the cost of running Beth Emeth, and we are looking upon this as a painless way to help us grow. (Details will follow.)

We will continue to have Thursday morning Minyans, Kabbalat Shabbat and Shabbat Services through the summer. We know a number of our members will be travelling, but if you are around, please try to attend at least one of these services so that we can be assured of a Minyan for anyone saying Kaddish.

I join with the entire Board in wishing you a safe, happy summer.

Yom HaShoah Commemorated in the West Valley

On the evening of Wednesday, April 27th, Congregation Beth Emeth (Sun City West) and Temple Beth Shalom (Sun City) came together to commemorate Yom HaShoah, the Jewish Holocaust Day of Remembrance. This year's Yom HaShoah program was adapted from a Yom HaShoah program created by Rabbi Robert Sternberg many years ago when he was director of the St. Louis Holocaust Museum and Learning Center. The words of the introduction to Yom HaShoah that were read at our program this year were also written by Rabbi Sternberg for the Yom HaShoah commemoration in St. Louis. We thank Rabbi Sternberg for his assistance with our program this year.

The candle lighting program was meaningful and informative. An additional thank you goes out to Dr. Ruth Callahan for her time in editing the program.

Cantor Baruch Koritan's musical renditions added depth and beauty, and we were pleased to have Gyorgyi Rosenthal who was a child survivor as one of our participants. Also participating in the program were Reverend Denise Landes and Jan Karns from the Unity Light of Grace Church. They represented the righteous gentiles during WWII, that risked their own lives to save Jewish lives.

After the program there was a graphic photo time line display for viewing, and Lee Shedroff provided information on the Holocaust Torah Scrolls that both synagogues are privileged to have on loan from the Westminster Synagogue Memorial Scrolls Trust, London.

FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK Yes, It really happened.

The recent events in Buffalo, New York brought back memories for more than one reason. First, because Buffalo was where I was born and raised. Second, because my family's business was near Jefferson Avenue, where a young man took the lives of many people because their skin was Black.

Yes, our auto parts store was less than a quarter mile from Jefferson Avenue and many of my customers were my neighbors, who lived and worked in what was once called the Genesee-Jefferson section. But I digress.

In what seems like a lifetime ago, I was active in an organization called an Optimist Club. If you know me at all, you are aware that when I get involved in anything, I give it my full attention, and pour my heart and soul into it. Such was my involvement in the Optimist Club, and I climbed the ladder of leadership in the organization until I found myself as Governor of the New York District of Optimist International.

The theme that our International President selected for that year, 1993-1994, was "Soar With Optimism," and each of the incoming District Governors weas given the task of building a new club during his or her term of office.

According to the training offered, the task of building a new club should have taken only a couple months, as each club was built around the needs of their community, and I knew that some of the youth in the neighborhood were locked out of what should have been an outdoor sports venue because of insurance issues. I also knew that Optimist Clubs carried the needed liability insurance.

It began with my contacting a neighbor, who operated a barber shop directly across the street from our store. Not only had I been his customer, he had also been a customer of mine and I knew also that he was the minister of his church, he was Black, and he knew many people in the community.


He invited me to attend a Sunday service in his church, and gave me the opportunity to tell his congregation about the Optimists.


I thought convincing his friends and congregation about what the organization could do in the community would be an easy sell, but it took me eleven months to finally charter what became the Inner City Optimist Club of Buffalo. As part of the package, I joined their club and was the only member who was not Black.

Members and leadership of all the clubs should have been able to attend meetings within the geographic zone of their clubs, and each zone was presided over by a Lieutenant Governor, an overseer who helped each club meet its goals and submit necessary paperwork.

Quite often, I was the only member of the Inner City Optimist Club who attended zone meetings, and it was at one of the zone meetings that I represented the club. Each club present was asked to report on the club's activities and the Lieutenant Governor, who knew I was the only White member, asked, me, "Are you a minority in the club?"

"Yes," I answered, "I am the only Jewish member."






CALLING ALL MEN
