




Our thanks to Rabbi Tracee Rosen for leading Shavuot Services .

### From the Editor's Desk



June is the sixth month on the secular calendar and was named for the Roman G-ddess Juno, patroness of marriage and the well-being of women. The name was also from the Latin word juvenis, "young people." And July was named to honor Roman dictator Julius Caesar who, in 46 B.C. made one of the greatest contributions to history: With the help of Sosigenes, he developed the Julian calendar, the precursor to the Gregorian calendar that we use today.

There are no Jewish holidays in June (other than Rosh Chodesh, which we observe every month), but the sixth of July marks the observance of Tzom Tammuz, the Fast of Tammuz, which falls on the seventeenth of that month on the Jewish calendar. Tradition ascribes several catastrophes to that day, most notably the breaching of the walls of the temple by the Romans (A.D. 70) and the incident of the golden calf at Sinai. Later in July we observe Tisha B'Av, when we begin our fast on Wednesday evening, and when the Book of Lamentations is read. The period between Tzom Tammuz and Tisha B'Av is referred to as The Three Weeks, with Tish B'Av designated as a day of mourning because of the catastrophes which occurred on that date.

There's something else on my mind aside from religious holidays...

I've also been thinking about our synagogue and how it has managed to survive. The answer is a simple one: VOLUNTEERS.

I have also thought about two simple words which probably express the feelings of many of us but are not spoken often enough: "THANK YOU!"

Words of thanks, for the individuals whose dedication to Beth Emeth include leading religious services on Sabbath, weekday minyans and during observances of Holy Days, are seldom expressed. Our members take for granted the hours of preparation and preplanning which go into providing a meaningful religious experience for each of us.

Let us not forget our president and Board of Directors who dedicate hours of their time and effort to what may seem the simple task of maintaining our synagogue. I'm thinking not only about religious services, but also the business of maintaining the building and grounds. IT'S NOT THAT SIMPLE!

Bear in mind the costs of water, electricity, cleaning, plumbing, landscaping, parking lot maintenance, maintaining the office, air conditioning and the kitchen equipment. I'm sure there is plenty I haven't thought about. All these expenses must be met, along with the salaries of office staff and clergy.

The weekly Shabbat Kiddush requires the dedication of personnel who care enough to create menus, spend hours in the kitchen, prepare and serve to everyone who attends services, then take the additional time to restore our social hall to its previous condition so it can be utilized by others.

Finally, please remember the people who go "above and beyond" the call of duty to present programs for our congregation and the community at large. We owe all of them a huge THANK YOU!






Our next Board meeting will be at the shul at a date and time to be announced. We will further seek to fill positions and identify upcoming events. Looking forward to seeing you there and working with you.
