# Words from the Heart: Reflections on Torah and Tradition by Hazzan Lev Ettelson

### לַיָּהוּדִּים הָיָתָה אוֹרָה וְשִּׁמְחָה וְשָּשׁן וִיקֵר:

"The Jews had light and gladness and happiness and honor." (Esther 8:16)

Purim is the archetypal Jewish holiday and the template for the old joke, "They tried to kill us, we survived, let's eat!" Indeed, feasting with friends is an integral part of the holiday. It is a holiday that represents unity as embodied in the Mitzvahs of sending food to friends and giving tzedakah unstintingly (we don't turn anyone away empty handed). Unlike all the other holidays, the events which we commemorate happened outside of the Land of Israel. Unlike the other Rabbinically decreed holiday of Hanukkah, the miracle was concealed.

The Sages teach us that there is an allusion to Purim in the Torah:

"And I will surely hide my face on that day for all the evils which they shall have perpetrated, in that they have turned to other gods." The words, "surely hide my face" in Hebrew are Haster Astir sharing the same root letters as Esther. Unique among the twenty-four books in the Tanach (Scriptures), G-d's name is not explicitly written once in Megillah Esther. The word HaMelech (The King), however, is written throughout the Megillah. Whenever it appears alone (without the name Achashverosh) this represents the Sovereign of the Universe. Curiously, the word HaMelech figures prominently in the high holiday liturgy. Indeed, the Talmud refers to Yom Kippur as Yom Ha-Ki-Purim: a day like Purim. The Sages teach us that in the Messianic Era, only two holidays shall remain, Purim and Yom Kippur.

On the surface, these two holidays seem opposite from one another, Yin (expansive) and Yang (constrictive). On Purim we dress in colorfully festive clothing, eating and drinking to excess until we reach the place of not knowing the difference between "Cursed be Haman and Blessed be Mordechai." On Yom Kippur we wear white, fasting until we reach an angelic state of consciousness where we are one with the One. These are two sides of the same coin. On Yom Kippur we transcend our physical needs to attain a state of purity and unity (devekut) while on Purim we indulge our senses to go beyond our usual limitations, in celebration of our union with G-d and one another. As it says in Psalms 100:2 "Serve G-d with happiness, come into the Presence with shouts of joy!"

There are times in our individual and collective lives when G-d's presence is greatly concealed. During these days of war and wide spread antisemitism, it is easy to fall into despair. Yet, we are witnessing the miracle of Jewish unity and awakening. Jews (and allies) all over the world are supporting one another in our homeland and in the diaspora in a variety of creative ways. Together we can accomplish great things; in joy we can transcend the barriers that exist among ourselves and between us and our Creator. During the Havdalah service we recite the verse that I quoted at the beginning and we add the words "So may it be for us." Amen!

### From the Editor's Desk

### **FOOD FOR THOUGHT??**

My 2016 Meriam-Webster Dictionary defines a minion as "1. A servile dependent, follower or underling; 2. One highly favored; 3. A subordinate official."

Missing is the definition as I would spell the word: minyan. Public worship cannot take place if there are fewer than ten Jews present. The following portions of the service are never said unless a minyan is present:

- Kaddish, the Sanctification of G-d's name
- Kedusha, a prayer in the Amidah, the Eighteen Benedictions
- Borchu, the call to bless G-d
- Birkat Kohanim, the Priestly Benediction
- Reader's repetition of the Amidah, the Eighteen Benedictions
- Reading of the Torah

The basis for requiring a minyan for prayers that sanctify G-d's name is the Biblical passage from Leviticus 22:32: "... that I may be sanctified in the midst of the Israelite people." The sanctification of G-d's Name is not a private matter, but a public act in the midst of a community.

This brings me to the actual topic of this month's article: THE MINYANAIRS. Who are they and what function do they perform at Beth Emeth?

Editorial license allows my personal observations: They are the glue which holds our congregation together. The men and women who assure attendance at Thursday's morning service, Friday's Erev Shabbat service and Saturday morning's Shabbat Service, and assure there is a minyan at the cemetery for funerals as well as Shiva Minyans at the homes of mourners. They're also the members of our congregation who regularly add to the Tzedakah pushke at our Thursday morning minyan.

And there's always room for you!




