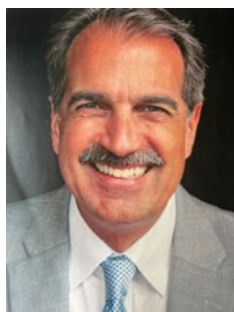

Beth Emeth Congregation of the West Valley is excited to be a host to **Professor Gary Rendsburg** during his week of shared learning opportunities in the Greater Phoenix area. Dr. Rendsburg holds the rank of Distinguished Professor and serves as the Blanche and Irving Laurie Chair of Jewish History at Rutgers University, NJ, with positions in the Department of Jewish Studies and the Department of History.

In addition to his lectures at Beth Emeth Congregation of the West Valley, he will be lecturing at venues in both the East and West Valleys. The venues include Synagogues, Churches, Educational institutions and a Senior Housing development. This very special lecture tour has been made possible by a grant from the Center for Jewish Philanthropy, and the generosity of our Sponsors and Supporters. The contributions towards Dr. Rendsburg's honorarium were made by each venue, and by our ticket sales.

Prof. Rendsburg is the author of seven books and more than 200 scholarly articles. He has produced two series for the Great Courses program, has lectured for Smithsonian Associates and for the Biblical Archaeology Society.

He has served as visiting research scholar at prestigious universities both domestically and worldwide including Israel, England, Australia, and Rome.

Yizkor appeal

As I was preparing to write my appeal, I began to brainstorm what Beth Emeth Congregation means to me. I grew up listening to Synagogue Presidents give this speech repeatedly enumerating long lists of updates being performed followed by an ask for money. Fortunately, I have no updates in that department as the air conditioning seems to work and the water is running okay!

What I do have is a different kind of list, this a place where I have formulated my Jewish identity. This is a place where I received opportunities to help others and learn the true definition of Mitzvah. This is a place where I have celebrated and mourned with friends and family. Most importantly this is a place that I call home.

To all the above, I ask are these things worth preserving?

To me, Synagogues are and will continue to be the center of Jewish life and do not necessarily have to be bricks and mortar, but just the center of Jewish life. As you know, there is a rise in Antisemitism and according to latest study 67% of all hate crimes are directed to Jews. Now more than ever, we need to stand together!

I must admit that I never understood the idea of asking for money on the Holiest day of the year. It always seemed misplaced and wrong to me, I came to realize that as Jews we do not pray alone, and we do not atone by ourselves Rather, we come together we stand and sit together hoping to be sealed for a good year. Having said all that, we agree that Beth Emeth Congregation and the community is important, and that praying together is important, so is **supporting financially** Beth Emeth Congregation most important!

So, I ask you - ***Will you make an investment in our community***, into our Home, into our Beth Emeth Congregation?

Reflections on Torah and Tradition

The Torah view of time is unique among other systems. Ours is a lunisolar calendar; unlike the Muslim (lunar) calendar in which Ramadan can occur in any season and the Gregorian calendar which is completely disconnected from the lunar cycles, our months always begin on the new moon and the 15th is always the full moon. Our holidays are always in sync with the seasons, i.e. Pesach is Chag Ha'Aviv, "the Springtime Holiday" that always occurs on the full moon in the month of Nissan near the time of the vernal equinox.

After the intensity of the month of Tishrei with four distinct yet interrelated holidays, comes Cheshvan, which is known as "Mar (bitter) Cheshvan" because it has no holidays. For me however, the 19th of Cheshvan is my father's first yahrzeit. In the 27th Psalm we recited from Rosh Chodesh Elul through Shemini Atzeret there is the verse: "Though my father and mother abandon me, Hashem will take me in." There comes a time in the life of every adult when both parents are no longer in this world. I was nearly 60 when my mother died a few years ago, giving us an opportunity for reconciliation. My father lived long enough to see me lead my first High Holidays at Beth Emeth Congregation which was a tremendous blessing for both of us.

This reminds me of a line from the *Samurai's Prayer* (ca. 1300 Japan): "I have no parents, I make the heaven and earth my mother and father." The next verse reads: "I have no home, I make awareness my home." There is a sense of poignancy here; With the passage of time, we are reminded of the fleeting nature of our lives. There is also an expanded sense of who we are. At times we may feel lonely, yet we are never truly alone. There are many ways that we can feel a greater sense of connection to that which is timeless. Whether through prayer, meditation, being in nature, learning Torah, creating art, dancing, exercise, loving, dreaming, writing or caring for others, "There are a thousand ways to kneel and kiss the ground; there are a thousand ways to go home again. (Rumi)" In the words of Kohelet: "For everything there is a season and there is a time for everything under the sky: A time to be born and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to uproot the planted... A time to weep and a time to laugh; a time to mourn and a time to dance."

Kohelet concludes with, "Remember your Creator... Before the darkening of the sun, the light, the moon and the stars; and the clouds return after the rain... Before the snapping of the silver cord, and the golden bowl is shattered; and the pitcher is broken at the fountain... after all has been heard; be in awe of G-d, and preserve the mitzvot, for this is the whole [duty] of humanity."

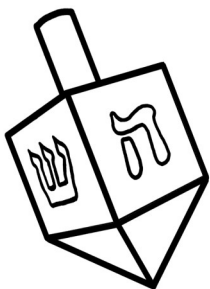

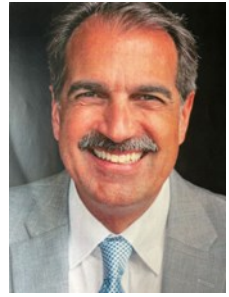
