



Reflections on Torah and Tradition Hazzan Lev Ettelson

What is Hannukah??

The Talmud asks "What is Hanukkah?" Hanukkah in America has become, for too many of our fellow Jews, a substitute for Xmas, but "instead of one night of presents we have eight crazy nights." This glorification of consumerism has obscured the deeper meaning of this minor holiday, especially with the 25th of Kislev (first night of Hanukkah) corresponding to December 25th this year. The word Hanukkah means "dedication" referring to the rededication of the Holy Temple after it was desecrated by the Greeks. It is also a cognate of the word חינוך Chinuch meaning education. Finally, Hanukkah can be broken down into two words: "חנו כ"ה They camped on the 25th." The 25th word of the Torah is אור which means light, which of course is a central theme of the holiday.

The dark of winter and the growing darkness of the waning moon (the new moon corresponds to the 7th day of Hanukkah) can lead to feelings of despair or hopelessness, yet we have been given an incredible gift, the ability to bring light into the world. Over the course of the holiday, we light thirty-six candles (not counting the shamash). The word "light" in all of its conjunctions, occurs thirty-six times in the Torah. Torah, the foundation of Jewish education, is first and foremost a guide to right living. The mitzvot, embedded in and the practical application of the Torah is, according to Lurianic Kabbalah, the way in which we bring more light into the world. When we dedicate our lives to being in harmonious relationship with the Holy One (and our fellow beings), we become partners in creating a world imbued with Divine wisdom and compassion.

According to the sage, Abaye, there are (at least) thirty-six (''') hidden tzadikim (righteous or saintly individuals) who receive the Shekhinah (The Divine Presence) every day and are the foundation of the world (elsewhere in the Talmud this number is 18,000 according to Rava). In our legends and lore (especially in Hasidism), there are many stories about the Lamed Vavnik (referring to the Hebrew letters which have the numerical value of 36) which illustrate this beautifully. You never know if the person sitting next to you is a Lamed Vavnik! Hanukkah is a celebration of the light which fills and surrounds us. Let us encourage one another to reveal that light to make this world shine just a little brighter.

Please note that once again this year I will be lighting the public Menorah at The Grand on the first night of Hannukah. Dec 25 at 5:20 pm.



Yahrzeit Plaques




Lecture Tour A Big Success





SCN - Secure Community Network Upcoming Training for our Congregation

Beth Emeth Congregation will be offering security training for our congregants in early 2025. This training will be provided by SCN.

To be sure that we are meeting the needs of our Congregation, we will be sending a questionnaire to each member. Once received, please return your completed questionnaire to the Beth Emeth office as soon as possible.

SCN is the official non-profit safety and security organization of the Jewish community in North America and works exclusively to protect our community, its culture, and to ensure that every person in our community can worship, gather, and celebrate in peace.

Our instructor will be David Humble. David Humble joined SCN in 2021 as the Regional Security Director for the Southwest Region. In this role, David is responsible for the oversight, development, and management of SCN's Regional Security Advisor (RSA) and SCN Community Security Director (CSD) programs in his region.

Before joining SCN, David was employed by the Tempe Police Department and retired as an Assistant Chief of Police. He served in executive-level and operational leadership roles within law enforcement, including Patrol Operations, Threat Mitigation Unit, Special Events Bureau, Gang and K9 Unit, Internal Affairs, Crime Prevention, Communications, and Community Affairs.

David has extensive supervisory experience in managing large-scale events, critical incidents, and directing proactive safety efforts in residential, business, and educational communities.

He holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Justice Studies and a Master of Public Administration from Arizona State University. He is also a graduate of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Academy and the Senior Management Institute for Police. He is also an active member of the International Association of Chiefs of Police and the FBI National Academy Associates.
