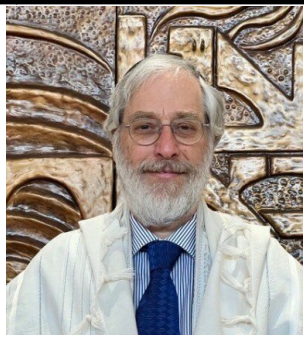

Reflections on Torah and Tradition

"When I marched in Selma, my feet were praying." These words of Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel z"l reflect his commitment to *tikkun olam* (repairing the world) and *tirdof tzeddek* (pursuing justice). His yahrzeit is the 18th of Tevet which this year comes less than two weeks before MLK Day. Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King o.b.m. invited Rabbi Heschel to speak at the 1963 National Conference on Religion and Race sparking their deep friendship and partnership in the Civil Rights Movement. Dr. King called Rabbi Heschel a prophet and they shared a commitment to the universal responsibility to fight injustice. Coretta Scott King invited Rabbi Heschel to speak at her husband's funeral.

Many of Rabbi Heschel's books focused on the prophetic voices within our tradition as well as the mystical aspects of Judaism embodied by the Hasidic masters of whom he was a descendant (his grandfather was the Apter Rav who is buried next to the Baal Shem Tov). The rabbi of my family's synagogue (Beth El 1969-1977) Samuel H. Dresner z"l, was at his bedside as he was recovering from a near fatal heart attack, when he said, "Sam, when I regained consciousness, my first feelings were not of despair or anger. I felt only gratitude to God for my life, for every moment I had lived. I was ready to depart. 'Take me, oh Lord,' I thought, 'I've seen so many miracles in my lifetime.' That is what I meant when I wrote, 'I did not ask for success; I asked for wonder. And You (God) gave it to me'"

Rabbi Heschel was also instrumental in influencing a radical shift in the Catholic Church's position on Jews. Thanks to his meeting with Pope Paul IV, *Nostra Aetate* (In Our Time - Declaration on the Relation of the Church with Non-Christian Religions) was issued at the Second Vatican Council (1965). The antisemitic doctrine of blaming the Jews for the death of Jesus, which was a contributing factor for the Holocaust, was nullified. It marked the beginning of a healing process whereby the Catholic Church acknowledged Jews as their "elder brothers (and sisters)", affirmed the eternal covenant between God and the People of Israel (ceasing proselytization) and sought forgiveness for centuries of persecution.

Rabbi Heschel and Reverend King embodied a shared prophetic tradition by standing against hatred, bigotry and injustice in all its forms. Their work is far from over as we witness a rise of xenophobia in our land and around the world. We are bombarded by voices of extremism and intolerance everyday. The persecution of the least powerful among us cries out for a compassionate and clear response. In the words of the prophet Micah, "What does God require of you but to do justice, to love kindness and to walk humbly with God."

As Rabbi Heschel wrote in his book, *God In Search of Man*, "A Jew is asked to take a leap of action rather than a leap of thought. He is asked to surpass his needs, to do more than he understands in order to understand more than he does. In carrying out the word of the Torah, he is ushered into the presence of spiritual meaning. Through the ecstasy of deeds he learns to be certain of the hereness of God. Right living is the way to right thinking." May the memory of this tzaddik be a blessing!

Repairing our Torah Scrolls - we need your help!!

As you know, our Torahs are in dire need of repair. It has come to the attention of the Board that significant fundraising is needed in order to repair our sacred Torah Scrolls.

At the Annual Meeting in December, Reb Lev donated \$72 in hopes others would do the same.

However, if every member donates just \$60.00, that would cover the cost for the Sofer to make the necessary repairs.

In addition, anyone who donates at least \$60.00 will get a beautiful certificate for their contribution to the repair of our Torah Scrolls.

The certificate can be issued in Memory of a loved one, or in Honor of a Birthday, an Anniversary or any other Milestone occasion.

Treasurer's Financial update

As of December 21st, we have had \$272,757.10 in income and \$295,991.44 in expenses. We are expecting a net shortfall of \$28,827.22 for the 2025 year. Please pay your remaining dues to help reduce this amount.

Dues

We still have \$4,050 in unpaid 2025 membership dues.

We accept payment in multiple forms, shown in order of preference.

Zelle payment to treasurer@bethemethaz.org, Check, Cash or Credit card. With a credit card payments, we pay a 2% fee per transaction, so we only get \$735 of a \$750 payment.

We are now accepting payments of 2026 dues.

At the December 21st, 2025 Congregation meeting, we approved this budget for 2026. Due to rising costs, we have increased individual dues to **\$800 for 2026**. This is a deficit budget with an expected shortfall of \$17,705.

Please see your financial advisor for details. You can include other donations besides your dues. Contact me for the Congregation's EIN which your IRA firm will require. Multiple members have taken advantage of this tax savings opportunity. Our Congregation's restricted funds allow you to specify how your donation will be used. Torah Maintenance Fundraiser: The donation will only be used for the repair of our Torahs. Only four of our Torahs are currently usable but need considerable repairs. Action depends on your donations so we can repair them. We need to raise \$6,000 to repair two of the Torahs. Biblical Garden: The donation will only be used for the Biblical Garden project.

Whereas it looks like we have a surplus, we do not have enough to accomplish our design goals.

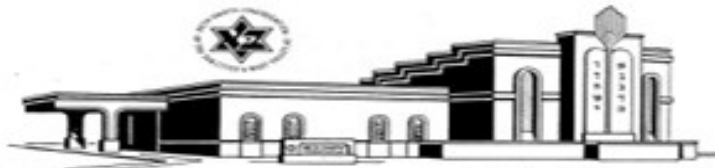
